## Reinstatement to F-1 Status

If you have violated the USCIS regulations about maintaining F-1 status, you need to file for reinstatement or try to regain your F-1 status by traveling out of and back into the U.S. with a new I-20. If you have violated status, and/or have had your status terminated, you should be aware that you are immediately accruing days of 'unlawful presence.' Violations of F-1 status include the following:

- Not reporting to the university designated official upon arrival
- Not updating your address properly and in a timely manner (within 10 days of any change)
- Not maintaining full-time academic registration without getting prior authorizations from a designated
  official
- The expiration of your I-20
- Not applying for a change in education degree level in a timely manner
- Not completing a school transfer properly
- Unauthorized employment (in this case, reinstatement in the U.S. is not possible)
- Attending a school other than that authorized

You must meet with your International Student Advisor in International Affairs to begin the process of applying for reinstatement. You should also speak with a good immigration attorney.

Eligibility to apply for reinstatement depends on the following:

- Student cannot have been out of status longer than 5 months, in most cases
- Student must be pursuing a full course of study or an authorized part-time course of study
- Student cannot have had unauthorized employment.
- The violation of status must have been due to a situation beyond the student's control
- It is helpful if it can be shown that denial of reinstatement will cause significant hardship

Another option to the reinstatement is to travel outside the U.S. and re-enter with a new initial I-20. In this case, the student would have to pay the SEVIS fee again and may have to apply for a new visa. In some situations, this would be a preferable course of action. You must discuss your situation with your international student advisor.

#### Required items for the reinstatement application:

- 1. Form I-539, completed (form is available at <a href="https://www.uscis.gov/i-539">https://www.uscis.gov/i-539</a>). Type in the fillable form.
- 2. **Application filing fee of \$370 plus an \$85 biometric services fee**, payable to the Department of Homeland Security (check or money order)
- 3. **Your original Form I-94** (printout of your I-94 from the CBP website)
- 4. The original Form I-94 for any F-2 dependents you may have
- 5. A photocopy of the visa page from your passport
- 6. A photocopy of the page(s) from your passport showing your photo and identification information, and showing your passport expiration date
- 7. **Original SEVIS I-20** (new one) issued to you by UCCS and recommending reinstatement and signed by you on page 1.

- 8. **Evidence of financial support** (letter of sponsoring agency if you are a sponsored student, proof of family funds if you are financing your own education, or proof of whatever funds you showed to receive your new I-20)
- 9. Photocopies of all previous I-20s issued to you by UCCS or any other institution
- 10. A detailed letter from you explaining:
  - Why you are out of status (specify the violation)
  - The reason why the violation occurred
  - Why you want reinstatement and the effect on you if you cannot receive reinstatement
  - A statement that you are pursuing or intending to pursue a full course of study
- 11. A letter from your International Student Adviser recommending reinstatement (if International Affairs supports your application)
- 12. An official and recent transcript from the UCCS Registrar's Office
- 13. A printout showing current or next semester class registration
- 14. **Optional** If you want to receive an email or text that the USCIS has received your application, include the Form G-1145, available here: <a href="http://www.uscis.gov/files/form/g-1145.pdf">http://www.uscis.gov/files/form/g-1145.pdf</a>. Be sure to attach this form to the first page of your application packet.

Make a copy of every item that you send, and make sure that your international student advisor has a copy.

### Please note:

While your application for reinstatement is pending (awaiting a decision), you must continue your full-time studies. If an application for reinstatement is denied:

- The visa that the student used to enter the United States is automatically cancelled.
- The student will have to depart the U.S. immediately.
- The student is permanently limited to applying for nonimmigrant visas in the future only in his or her country of citizenship or permanent residence.
- The student will begin accumulating days of "unlawful presence" in the U.S.
