General Information about the University (location, number of students, faculties)	UCCS is located in the East Central portion of Colorado overlooking Pikes Peak. It is 1 hour south of Denver and stands over 1609 meters above sea level. UCCS has approximately 12,180 students, more than 800 experienced faculty members and more than 800 devoted staff members. UCCS has 6 areas of studies: Education, Health Sciences, Business, Engineering and Applied Sciences, Public Affairs, and Letters, Arts, and Sciences UCCS offers 49 Baccalaureate Programs, 24 Master's Programs, 7 Doctoral Programs, and 28 Certificate Programs. UCCS is part of the Colorado University (CU) system, which has four campuses located in Denver, Boulder, Aurora, and Colorado Springs.

Bachelor level students	Due to the courses available for exchange students during the Fall, we recommend students at the bachelor level to spend a Fall semester at UCCS. All students return to campus for the Fall semester, so this offers an opportunity to meet fellow students which can be easier than attending during the Spring semester
Master level students	While UCCS does welcome graduate level students, it is something that is evaluated on a case by case basis and as such not guaranteed.
"Add and Drop" periods	UCCS allows students to add/drop classes up until the census date—which varies depending on the semester. Once census date has arrived, students must be enrolled in the minimum credit requirements. UCCS will lock student's ability to add/drop classes after census date.
